## **Prioritizing, Praying and Planning**

Jesus' priority is to save whomsoever believe. He prayed to seek guidance from God on how to achieve this and set out a plan of action to train 12 men, their associates and then 70 others to become disciples. When Jesus returned to heaven after the Resurrection on what we call Easter, God poured out his Holy Spirit on the disciples and their numbers multiplied. This outpouring as mentioned in Joel above has continually been happening since then to whosoever catches the vision to duplicate what Jesus did by setting their priority to serve God, pray for His guidance, and then proceed with a plan of action to disciple

faithful people who will teach others. This priority is being realized in Tha Bo a city district like many in Thailand where there are no protestant churches or church groups. Since the beginning of 2010 three individuals working with Vision 7 have been praying for a break though in this barren city. A light of hope has begun to be realized as Mr. Samaan, a Thai Evangelist with the ministry of healing (see previous newsletter) and a group of 40 orphans consisting of Thais and Hill Tribe teenagers blessed Tha Bo by performing dramas, worship songs and powerful Bible teachings that saw around 20 people healed on both

Monday and Tuesday night of March 15-16. In addition, with solicitation of prayers from people concerned with Thailand a second group of 10 people from Norway including two Americans on Saturday, March 20 performed an uplifting praise and worship outreach in the middle of a crowded market place where many people listened. Individuals were given the book of John, a Thai DVD about being saved by Christ, and invited to the new church group at both events. The next day Sunday, March 21 the team was present for the opening of the first church group focusing on discipleship training.



## **A Team of Laypersons and Spiritual Leaders**

If you are willing to stand in the gap and pray for God's guidance, and be available to use your God given gifts to be the arms and legs of God, then He can use you, me, and ordinary laypersons to team up with spiritual visionary leaders to get the job done in Thailand. God may even use

laypersons to reach others where the gospel has not yet been preached to build a spiritual foundation. God used Nehemiah, a layperson with the gift of administration, who felt a burden to pray about rebuilding to organize a scared group of people to do the work of God. Thailand needs laypersons like

Nehemiah, whether young, middle age, or old, to take a short leave from their job, home, or church to go use their unique talents to help tell people about Jesus. Your prayers, talents and financial support are needed to help Thailand grow from 1% to over 7%, Christians, especially in Tha Bo. Pray and go.
